Today we welcomed Philip to the Tiger's room. The Tiger children were very nice and made Philip feel comfortable to be apart our little family. As it was wet outside we spent our morning inside. Before morning tea we had roll call and greeted each other politely. We talked about some changes with in the Tiger's room in the coming days. Home corner will be changed into a vet clinic as the children are more and more fascinated with pretending to be pets and taking care of each other.



We had almost half the children pretending to be cats and dogs at one point-it was funny to watch. Miss Mea and Miss Monisha will extend on this type of role play and bring in more resources for us such as soft toys and vet tools. It is great to see such imaginative play as it teaches cooperation and communication in a respectful way. The children can apply information they have learnt into their role play as a way of exploring the world around them.



By turning our home corner into a Vet's clinic-the children can gain a realistic view of an important 'community helper' and understand the importance of their job in the community. Miss Monisha and Miss Mea also hope to see the children respecting the special space and taking care of the new resources made available to them.

During Mat time just before lunch we talked about x-rays that we might see at a Vet's clinic. Miss Mea explained about a special machine that can see the bones inside the body. Where do you take your pet if it is sick? Miss Mea asked the children. "The hospital" answered some of the children. "Close, you take them to a Vet, a vet is an animal doctor" explained Miss Mea. "Sometime to see what is wrong with your pet –they have an x-ray". She then showed the children pictures of animals and their x-rays. The children were so fascinated by them so we decided to make an x-ray of a cat for craft time.

For craft the children were given a cat cut-out and all they had to do was glue the bones on. Miss Mea had cut out different pieces of white paper for the children to arrange into bones. We talked about a cat having a back bone and lots of little bones everywhere. We also found out that cats have bones in their long tails. The children were excited to make an x-ray– some of them even made two. Art experiences like this can teach the children many skills. For example holding a brush and holding the paper at the same time, placement-placing the bones where it is needed and not to mention-it is visually stimulating. The children did a great job!
